This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education. Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Stockton Wood Primary School follows the Charanga Model Music Curriculum Scheme of work. Children with SEND are fully immersed in the school's music curriculum and supported to achieve their true potential using adaptive teaching. Each class receives an hour of music per week, through 20 minutes singing practise and a 40-minute lesson delivered by the class teacher. We have a class set of glockenspiels, which support the Charanga units. In EYFS, children learn and sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs. They perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others and try to move with the music.

Our Year 4 children access the wider opportunities curriculum and have a whole class keyboard lesson once a week. Year 3 children learn to play the recorder, lessons are delivered by class teachers and by our Music Hub specialist, Stockton Wood Primary School have a close working relationship with Resonate Music Hub who fully support the school for CPD and other advice that teachers and the music lead may need.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

This year, pupils at Stockton Wood will have the opportunity to join our Key Stage 2 choir.

School are currently researching additional musical opportunities in the form of after school clubs led by external providers.

Part C: Musical Events

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

The children at Stockton Wood Primary School enjoy weekly singing practice and also have the chance to sing along to music during Monday assemblies. In addition, children perform to their parents during both our Christmas Performances and end-of-year Stay and Celebrate assemblies.
