



Early Years Intimate Care – Home and School Roles and Responsibilities

If a child is still in nappies, parents and carers are expected to provide a bag with a suitable quantity of nappies and wipes, and where necessary, change of clothes.

If a child requires prescribed cream administering, parents and carers are expected to sign a consent form beforehand. These forms can be acquired from the school office. Please note, any cream that is administered must be prescribed by a medical professional with a label outlining the dose and frequency.

The Parent/Guardian must:

- Ensure that my child is changed at the latest possible time before being brought to the setting.
- Provide the setting with spare nappies, wipes and clothes.
- Read the intimate care policy in order to understand and agree to the procedures that will be followed when my child is changed within the setting.
- Inform the setting if the child has any marks/rash that staff need to be mindful of.

Staff at the Setting:

- Agree to changing the child should they soil themselves or become uncomfortably wet (please note: this includes water play).
- Agree to monitor and log the number of times a child is changed.
- Agree to report to families should the child become distressed, or if marks or rashes are seen.
