How has Liverpool changed in my family's history?



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
Our Finding Out Activity is:

At home, you can:

- Ask your parents/carers and grandparents about what Liverpool was like when they were growing up. (Perhaps you could explore some photos!) What is the same and what is different? What has changed? If they came to Stockton Wood as children, what was it like? (If your family didn't grow up in Liverpool, you can still talk about their childhoods in their home town. How is it different to yours?)
- Look at buildings in our city and think about whether they are 'old' or 'new'.
- Find out information about the history of Liverpool and its historical landmarks.
- If possible, visit a historical landmark and/or museum (e.g. Speke Hall, Sudley House, Museum of Liverpool, etc). You can tell us all about your visit in school!
