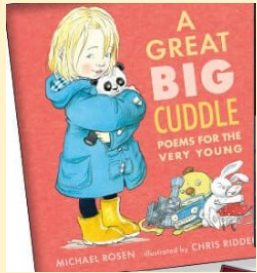
Our Reading Spine provides children with access to a wide range of high-quality age appropriate fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts that are enjoyed through shared reading sessions, English lessons, reading for pleasure and also through the wider curriculum.

Teachers will work with their classes to choose books from the reading spine that they would like to read as a whole class read for pleasure.

In Year R, children are recommended to read 3 of these books per half term for pleasure, in addition to the vehicle texts and extracts from the Ready Steady Comprehension texts.
